1. REVENUE FROM OPERATIONS:

Your Company total income during the year under review was **35.31 Crores** as compared to Rs 26.29 crores in the previous year.

3. **DIVIDEND**:

Your Directors have not recommended any dividends for the financial year 2023-24

4. SHARE CAPITAL:

The paid-up Equity Share capital of the company as on 31st March 2024 was Rs 1,26,21,840/-. The company has not issued any shares with differential voting rights, employee stock option and sweat equity shares. The Company has not issued any rights issue or bonus issue during the financial year 2023-24. The company has not bought back any of its securities during the year under review.

5. MATERIAL CHANGES:

There has been no material changes and commitment, affecting the financial performance of the company which occurred between the end of the financial year to which the financial statements relate and the date of this Report.

6. COMPANY PERFORMANCE:

During the financial year 2023-24, the Company harvested Arabica crop of 112 tonnes and Robusta crop of 78 tonnes as against 231 tonnes of Arabica 72 tonnes of robusta in the previous year. Further, the Company successfully sold the harvested crop and purchased crop of 832 tons of the season 2022-23 and realised a sum of Rs 33.27 crores. The Coffee crop for the season 2023-24 has been valued using Net realizable value.

The Company was able to export 177 tonnes of coffee against 183 tonnes in the previous year.

Company is witnessing good demand for its harvested crop. Our processing methods and the cup quality are highly appreciated in the Specialty market. The Company also procures coffee from well identified farmers whose processing and farming techniques are at par with Sangameshwar Coffee Estates Limited. This has created a space for procuring coffees directly from small farmers helping them to improve farming methods and earn better prices. This strategy has worked well for the Company. The Company shall continue to operate in this vertical to improve its turnover and profitability in the coming years.

In recent years we have observed a notable decrease in the export volume of coffee, primarily attributed to a significant rise in domestic demand. This shift has been driven by a change in consumer preferences favoring higher quality coffee products, particularly specialty coffees. As a result, domestic market prices have become more lucrative compared to export markets, leading to a redirection of supply chains and strategic focus towards meeting local demand. This report examines the factors contributing to this trend and forecasts the outlook for the specialty coffee sector.

7. FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE:

The Company's Directors are pleased to inform you that the company has incurred a loss of Rs 455.49 lakhs after tax adjustment. Due to steep increase in the cost of purchases, operating margins contracted drastically, the Company was not able to generate the positive cash flows from the operating activities.

8. **OPERATIONAL PERFORMANCE:**

The Company has harvested 112 tones of Arabica and 78 tons of Robusta.

The poor coffee harvest during the year, due to climate change and untimely rain. Coffee production has been significantly impacted, causing concerns resulting in poor yield.

a. Climate Change:

Temperature Variability: There has been a noticeable shift in temperature patterns, affecting the growth and flowering cycles of coffee plants. Higher temperatures have led to stress on plants, affecting their overall productivity.

Erratic Rainfall: Climate change has also resulted in unpredictable rainfall patterns. Extended dry periods followed by sudden heavy rains can disrupt flowering and fruit development in coffee plants, leading to reduced yields.

b. Untimely Rain:

Impact on Blossom: Coffee plants require specific conditions for flowering and fruit setting. Untimely rains during critical growth stages can wash away blossoms or cause fungal infections, reducing the number of cherries produced.

Increased Pest and Disease Pressure: Moist conditions due to unexpected rains create a conducive environment for pests and diseases, further impacting plant health and yield.

The poor harvest of coffee due to these climate-related factors has several implications:

Quality Concerns: Reduced yield often correlates with lower quality coffee beans, impacting market prices and export revenues.

Measures taken by Management:

To mitigate the impact of climate change on coffee production, the following measures are taken:

Adoption Strategies: Promote the adoption of sustainable agricultural practices and water management techniques to improve soil health and water retention.

In conclusion, the poor coffee harvest during the year can largely be attributed to climate change and untimely rain, which have adversely affected coffee production. Urgent action is needed from all stakeholders in the coffee industry to adopt the changing climatic conditions and ensure the sustainability of coffee production in the long term.

9. RAINFALL:

Estates witnessed unfavorable rainfall in the Chikmagaluru region during the year 2023. The unusual rains during November and December created panic among coffee growers. There was adverse effect on the Drying of coffees at the Estate resulting in the out-turn loss. **The comparative rainfall details are annexed for reference:**

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

NOTES to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March 2024

1.1 Company Information:

Sangameshwar Coffee Estates Limited is public unlisted Company with Registered office at Karadykan Estate, Sangameshwarpet, Chikamagaluru District 577136.

The Company is in the business of Coffee growers and Exporters having coffee planation in Chikmagaluru District and Chamarajanagar District.

1.2 Basis of prepration and Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation of financial statements:

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention, on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India ('Indian GAAP') and comply with the Accounting standards prescribed in the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 which continue to apply under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, ('the Act') read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014.

1.3 Key Accounting Estimates & Judgements

"The preparation of standalone financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Continuous evaluation is done on the estimation and judgments based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively."

1.4 Amendments to Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013

Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) issued notifications dated 24th March, 2021 to amend Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013 to enhance the disclosures required to be made by the Company in its financial statements. These amendments are applicable to the Company for the financial year starting 1st April, 2021 and applied to the standalone financial statements as required by Schedule III

1.5 Significant Accounting policies

The significant accounting policies used in preparation of the standalone financial statements are as under

(a) Property Plant and Equipment

Tangible fixed assets are carried at the cost of acquisition or construction, less accumulated depreciation. The cost of fixed assets includes taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from tax authorities), duties, freight and other directly attributable costs related to the acquisition including development expenditure incurred on new clearing of the respective assets. Profit or Loss on disposal of tangible assets is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Property, plant and equipment is stated at acquisition cost net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Cost of acquisition or construction of property, plant and equipment comprises its purchase price including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes after deducting trade discounts, rebates and any directly attributable cost of bringing the item to its working condition for its intended use. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance cost are charged to the standalone statement of profit and loss during the period in which they are incurred.

Gains or losses that arise on disposal or retirement of an asset are measured as the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying value of property, plant and equipment and are recognized in the statement of profit and loss when the same is derecognized.

Depreciation is calculated on pro rata basis on straight-line / WDV method based on estimated useful life prescribed under Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. Freehold land is not depreciated.

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources.

(b) Impairment of Assets: - In accordance with (AS-28) – Impairment of Assets, the carrying amounts of the Company's assets including intangible assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indications exist, the assets recoverable amount is estimated, as the higher of the net selling price and the value in use. An impairment loss is recognized whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount. If at the balance sheet date, there is an indication that a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is assessed at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciable historical cost.

(c) Revenue recognition:

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that, the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably estimated and collectability is reasonably assured.

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised when control of the products being sold is transferred to our customer and when there are no longer any unfulfilled obligations. The Performance Obligations in our contracts are fulfilled at the time of dispatch, delivery or upon formal customer acceptance depending on customer terms.

Revenue is measured on the basis of sale price, after deduction of any trade discounts, volume rebates and any taxes or duties collected on behalf of the Government such as goods and services tax, etc. Accumulated experience is used to estimate the provision for such discounts and rebates. Revenue is only recognised to the extent that it is highly probable a significant reversal will not occur.

Unbilled revenue represents earnings on ongoing fixed price and time and material contracts over and above the amounts invoiced to customers.

- a) All income and expenses are accounted on accrual basis.
- b) Subsidies are accounted on receipt basis. However, there are no subsidy receipts during the year.

Other revenues

Income from interest is being accounted for on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the applicable rate of interest.

(d) Employee Benefits:

Employee benefits payable wholly within 12 months of leaving employee services are classified as short term employee benefits. These benefits include salaries and wages bonus and ex- gratia. The undiscounted amount of short term employee benefits to be paid in exchange for employee services is recognized as an expense as the related services is rendered by employees.

Provident Fund

Eligible employees receive benefits from the provident fund, which is a defined contribution plan. Both the employee and the Company make monthly contributions to the provident fund plan equal to specified percentage of the covered employees' basic salary. The Company has no further obligations under the plan beyond its monthly contributions. Contributions to provident fund are charged to the statement of profit and loss on accrual basis.

Gratuity

The Company provides gratuity, a defined benefit retirement plan covering eligible employees. The Company provides the gratuity benefit through annual contribution to Sangamehwar Coffee Estates Employees Gratuity Fund Trust.

(e) Foreign currency transactions:

Foreign exchange transactions are recorded at the rate prevailing on the date of the respective transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies as at the balance sheet date are translated at the closing exchange rates on that date. Non monetary items which are carried in terms of historical

cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences arising on foreign exchange transactions settled during the year and on restatement as at the balance sheet date are recognized in the statement of profit and loss for the year.

(f) Income Tax

Income-tax expense comprises current tax (i.e. amount of tax for the period determined in accordance with the income-tax law) and deferred tax charge or credit effects of timing differences between accounting income and taxable income for the period). Income-tax expense is recognised in profit or loss except that tax expense related to items recognised directly in reserves is also recognised in those reserves.

Current tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to (recovered from) the taxation authorities, using the applicable tax rates and tax laws. Deferred tax is recognised in respect of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income i.e. differences that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. The deferred tax charge or credit and the corresponding deferred tax liabilities or assets are recognised using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent there is reasonable certainty that the assets can be realised in future; however, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward loss under taxation laws, deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is a virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed as at each balance sheet date and written down or written-up to reflect the amount that is reasonably/virtually certain (as the case may be) to be realised.

Minimum Alternative Tax ('MAT') under the provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961 is recognised as current tax in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The credit available under the Act in respect of MAT paid is recognised as an asset only when and to the extent there is convincing evidence that the company will pay normal income tax during the period for which the MAT credit can be carried forward for set-off against the normal tax liability. MAT credit recognised as an asset is reviewed at each balance sheet date and written down to the extent the aforesaid convincing evidence no longer exists.

(g) Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets

A provision is recognized when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event i.e., it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

A contingent liability exists when there is a possible but not probable obligation, or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources, or a present obligation whose amount cannot be estimated reliably. Contingent liabilities do not warrant provisions, but are disclosed unless the possibility of outflow of resources is remote. Contingent assets are neither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements. However, contingent assets are assessed continually and if it is virtually certain that an inflow of economic benefits will arise, the asset and related income are recognised in the period in which the change occurs

(h) Earnings per Share

Basic earnings per equity share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting preference dividends and attributable taxes, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to the equity shareholders of the Company and weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per equity share and also the weighted average number of equity shares that could have been issued upon conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares. In computing dilutive earnings per share, only potential equity shares that are dilutive and that decrease profit per share are included.

(k) Cash flow statement:

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method as specified under Accounting Standard - 3, whereby profit before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non-cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated.
